

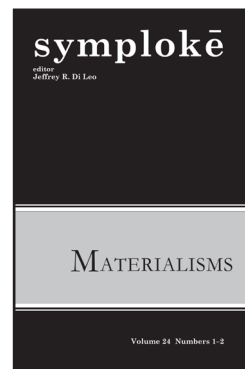

Scholarship focusing on the interrelationship of philosophy, literature, cultural criticism, and intellectual history is of particular interest. *symplokē* received the Phoenix Award 2000 for Outstanding Editorial Achievement from the Council of Editors of Learned Journals.
